A before school gathering for parents/caregivers of young children going to school might be helpful. An opportunity to network with other parents/caregivers to share their fears, concerns and previous years achievements.

Perhaps have P2P Coordinator talk briefly about IEPs. ie. All goals don't have to be academic; some may be about social, emotional or adaptive skills. Let them know they have a say about their child's IEP.
